Students are allowed to use their points to purchase items/privileges at the school store on a weekly basis. The goals of the School-Wide Behavior Plan are to help enhance appropriate behaviors and necessary daily living skills, as well as the understanding and value of money.

TIEGERMAN HISTORY

Tiegerman (formerly known as SLCD) opened in 1985 as one of the first programs of its kind in New York State, providing intensive language immersion and educational programming for preschool students. Tiegerman has expanded to serve students in grades K-12 from Long Island and New York City and remains one of the few specialized schools in the nation for children with language and autism spectrum disorders.

MISSION

The Tiegerman mission of "Teaching the Extraordinary" reflects the organization's goal to substantively transform the lives of individuals with special needs from preschool throughout adulthood. We are committed to providing exceptional instruction, education, and support to ensure that children and adults achieve their potential in life. We believe that each individual is extraordinary and through our extraordinary efforts they will achieve a more independent and successful future.

CURRICULUM

Tiegerman's curriculum and instructional programs are aligned with New York State Learning Standards. Our classrooms are designed to meet the diverse learning styles of our students and ensure that instruction matches these learning styles. Students are actively engaged in learning through multisensory, hands-on socially infused activities designed to meet the unique needs of each learner as outlined in his/her IEP. Tiegerman's intensive student teacher ratios provide for the provision of individualized instruction that is critical to helping our students achieve high academic standards and learning expectations as well as a bridge to independence.

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

- Programming at Tiegerman School at Woodside focuses on providing high-quality instruction for children who have social challenges, cognitive challenges, and learning challenges
- Tiegerman provides intensive, 12-month educational programming with self-contained classrooms structured with the following student teacher ratios: 8-1-2 and 12-1-2
- Instruction is provided in an environment that is rich in social skills training, while enhancing the learning of academic material with the support of psychologists and counselors, physical therapists, occupational therapists, speech language pathologists, behavior specialists, and registered behavioral technicians (RBTs)
- Tiegerman utilizes a descriptive and qualitative approach to understanding the developmental needs of students with disabilities
- Tiegerman serves students with Autism, Learning Disability, Other Health Impairment, Speech/ Language Impairment, Intellectual Disability, Emotionally Disabled, Hearing Impairment and Traumatic Brain Injury
- Tiegerman utilizes a transdisciplinary model dedicated to the enhancement of each child's social and cognitive development
- Instruction throughout the school day emphasizes social and cognitive skills, and facilitates peer interaction and development
- Tiegerman provides social supports to students that experience difficulties with socialization and anxiety
- Tiegerman School at Woodside explores the essence of a child, rather than solely looking at educational classifications and/or medical diagnoses



SERVICES

An intense level of service provision to address social deficits is offered at Tiegerman's Woodside program. The philosophical focus on social semiotics is what distinguishes Tiegerman's Woodside Program from Tiegerman's Language Infusion Elementary School in Glen Cove.

- On average, our students receive the following weekly services:
 - Counseling 4 to 5 times a week
 - Daily Social Skills Training
 - Daily Reading Interventions
 - Occupational Therapy
 2 to 3 times a week
 - Physical Therapy1 to 2 times a week
 - Speech Language Therapy
 2 to 3 times a week
- Counselors work in the classrooms and provide individual and group services to develop social skills and provide classroom staff with social skills supports, such as peer mediation, social scripts, and social stories for disorders, such as social anxiety, school phobia, ADHD
- Behavior Specialists assess students with social skill
 deficits related to peer interaction issues and peer
 mediation. In addition, they collect data on
 students, work with the classroom staff and
 counseling staff to devise plans, strategies, and
 techniques to assist the student with social needs
- All classroom instruction and related services focus on the development of academic skills through the enhancement of each child's social and cognitive development
