
#### Important Laws

Enforcements Act- The law passed in 1870- 1871. It prohibit the use of force to prevent people from voting, granted federal oversight of local elections, and made tactics used by the KKK illegal federal offenses.

Act Creating an Electoral Commission- It was passed on January 29, 1877. It regulates the counting votes for the presidents and vice presidents.

The Compromise of 1877- It was an agreement between southern Democrats and allies of the Republican Rutherford Hayes to settle the result of the 1876 presidential election and marked the end of the Reconstruction.



Tiegerman Preschool at Far Rockaway is continuing to have a wonderful school year!

In November, each class hosted a Parent Participation Day in their classrooms. Parents were able to come in to complete an art project with their child, see a class performance or participate in centers. Students beamed with pride when they welcomed their parents into their classrooms and our parents truly enjoyed themselves! Each class also resumed our Mystery Reader Program. Parents and family members are consistently invited to read to their child's class (and surprise them).

In December, the school hosted its annual David's Cookie Dough Fundraiser! Parents and staff sold 152 boxes of cookies, raising significant funds for the program! These funds will be used to hire a magician for an exciting school event this spring. December also featured a Character Day for our students. In January, all classrooms and departments participated in a door-decorating contest to celebrate Tiegerman's 40th Anniversary. They were tasked with incorporating the number 40 in their creations. Each door was beautiful and truly captured the Tiegerman spirit!

In February, the PTFA hosted its first ever Scholastic Book Fair and it was a huge success! The fair sold \$2,700 worth of books. The students enjoyed shopping for their favorite titles, and the event brought so many wonderful parent volunteers! The school also celebrated its 100th and 101st days of school in February! For the 100th Day, every student decorated their own 100th day wearable vest and wore special gear (i.e., crowns, glasses). Each class also had a glow stick party to demonstrate they were "100 Days Brighter." For the 101st Day, students and staff wore black, white or polka dots to resemble Dalmatians from the movie, 101 Dalmatians.

For the month of February, students participated in a Ball unit of study, which was derived from the Creative Curriculum. To celebrate the end of the unit, students "played ball" in the indoor gym and wore their favorite sports jerseys and hats to school! The school's related service providers organized and facilitated engaging ball activities, such as catch, baseball, and therapy ball exercises.

Lastly, to highlight the contributions and dedication of the school staff, the Spirit Committee created the Staff Spotlight Award. The Spirit Committee honors one staff member bi-weekly and the committee requests ongoing staff nominations. 
